FROM THE CHAIRMAN



Hello,

Thank you for your interest in the Hope Scholarship program and educational choice options in West Virginia.

In 2021, the West Virginia Legislature passed and Gov. Jim Justice signed House Bill 2013, creating the Hope Scholarship Program – hailed by many as one of the broadest educational freedom and school choice initiatives in the country. The bill entrusted responsibility of this program to the Hope Scholarship Board, with the State Treasurer serving as chairman and my Office providing staffing and logistical support for the program.

As soon as the bill became law, my Office and this Board began working diligently to get this program up and running to meet the startup deadlines established under law. We were proud to open the application period on time with the ability to meet the strong demand we saw for the program. More than 4,000 students and their families applied during the initial application period, with more than 3,000 of those applications approved with students set to receive the Hope Scholarship in the first year. While we were incredibly successful in launching this program on time to meet great demand, we unfortunately encountered a significant challenge in July 2022 when a Circuit Court presiding over a lawsuit challenging the constitutionality of the Hope Scholarship Act issued an injunction that halted all activity in the program – including our planned first round of payments that August. This left more than 3,000 families in limbo over how to educate their children for the upcoming school year. Thankfully, in October 2022, the state Supreme Court overturned this injunction and ruled the program constitutional.

As soon as that Supreme Court ruling was handed down, my Office and the Board began working around-the-clock to restart the program. I'm proud to say that, even in the face of these significant challenges and legal delays, we were able to fully launch this program by January 2023 and provide full-year funding to families who had been depending on the program to educate their children. While some families who had initially been awarded the Hope Scholarship opted out of the program for the first year as a result of the injunction period, 2,333 students ended up participating in the program during its first year – a tremendous success given all the challenges these families, students and this program had to overcome.

With this initial year under our belt, the 2023-2024 school year will be the first full year of the Hope Scholarship, and interest appears to be nearly double what it was during the 2022-2023 academic year. Going into the 2023-2024 school year, our Board has already received over 6,900 applications and awarded the Hope Scholarship to more than 6,000 students – a phenomenal growth rate for the second year of this program.

I want to express my sincere thanks to the Hope Scholarship Board, our staff and the families involved in this program for their hard work and patience as we worked diligently to launch this program. It is clear there is a strong desire for school choice and educational freedom in West Virginia and I'm proud to help every family and child be able to obtain the educational opportunities they believe work best for them.

HOPE SCHOLARSHIP 101

What is the Hope Scholarship?

The Hope Scholarship is an education savings account program available for kindergarten through 12th grade students. It is designed to allow parents and families to use the state portion of their child's education funding to tailor an individualized learning experience that works best for their child.

When was it created?

The Legislature passed the Hope Scholarship Act during the 2021 legislative session to help expand school choice options for West Virginia students and families.

When did it launch?

Applications for the 2022-2023 school year launched on March 1, 2022. More than 3,000 students were originally awarded the scholarship for the 2022-2023 school year; however, a Circuit Court injunction against the program halted all program operations from July to October 2022. After the injunction was overturned and the program resumed in the middle of the academic year, many families did not want to disrupt their child's education by changing their school choice in the middle of a school year. The 2022-2023 school year finished with **2,333 scholarship participants**.

Who is eligible?

To qualify for the Hope Scholarship, a student must be a West Virginia resident and be either:

- Eligible to be enrolled in a kindergarten program.
- Enrolled full-time in a public elementary or secondary school program in this state for the entire instructional term of the academic year preceding the year for which the student is applying to participate in the program.
- Or, enrolled full-time and attending a public elementary or secondary school program in this state for at least 45 consecutive calendar days during an instructional term at the time of application. The student must remain enrolled and attending public school until a decision is reached on their application.

How can someone apply?

Applications and program information are available online at www.HopeScholarshipWV.com. The current legislative rules, adopted by the Board, set the application window from March 1 to May 15 annually. Students ineligible to apply during the application window but who became newly eligible for the program under the 45-day rule were eligible to apply at any time during the year. In addition, the Hope Scholarship Board accepted late applications from eligible students who missed the application deadline on a case-by-case basis due to extenuating circumstances.

How much money does the scholarship provide?

It will vary each year depending on the amount of state aid funding per pupil provided to county boards of education for public school students. For the 2022-2023 school year, the scholarship amount was **\$4,298.60**.

How are Hope Scholarship funds distributed and spent?

For the 2022-2023 academic year, the Treasurer's Office contracted with a third party to administer Hope Scholarship accounts electronically through the Education Market Assistant (EMA). The Education Market Assistant functions as a digital wallet and serves as a scholarship management platform for parents and providers. Each family has access to an EMA account for each eligible student in their household. Families then spend their Hope Scholarship funds directly through the EMA platform with participating schools, enrolled education providers, and vendors for qualifying expenses. Payments for qualifying Hope purchases are made via an ACH transaction directly to the school, vendor or supplier.

What can Hope Scholarship money be used for?

Qualifying educational expenses under the Hope Scholarship Act and legislative rules include but are not limited to:

- Tuition and fees for private school, nonpublic online programs, or alternative education programs
- Services provided by a public school (extracurricular, individual courses)
- Tutoring services
- Fees for standardized or advanced placement exams
- Fees for preparation courses
- Educational services and therapies
- Supplemental materials (supplies, textbooks)
- Transportation fees
- Any other qualifying expense as approved by the Hope Scholarship Board

When do funds become available for families?

Under the Hope Scholarship Act, funds are statutorily designed to be distributed in two equal installments: the first half available in student accounts by August 15 annually with the second half available by January 15 annually. However, as a result of the Circuit Court injunction delay in mid-2022, most payments for the 2022-2023 school year were made in one full-year payment beginning in January, with some students receiving prorated amounts if they had remained in public school during the injunction period and later transitioned to a nonpublic education environment after the state Supreme Court lifted in the injunction.

**Applications marked as declined were initially awarded but the student subsequently decided not to participate in the program. Due to the Circuit Court injunction that halted the program's startup from July through October 2022, many families and students who had been initially approved for the Hope Scholarship eventually declined the award after the program restarted in October, mostly due to not wanting to disrupt the student's education environment in the middle of the school year. Many of these families decided to wait and re-apply for the scholarship for the following academic year.*

Full-year award per pupil: \$4,298.60*

**Due to the injunction and some students remaining in public school during the time the program was halted, some students were issued prorated Hope Scholarship amounts that were reduced in order to account for the student's time spent in the public school system.*



(Grade Level as Reported at Time of Application)




***NOTE:** On the 2022-2023 Hope Scholarship application, students reported their current grade level at the time of application. The grade-level data provided above is pulled directly from the student applications. The Hope Scholarship application has been modified moving forward for subsequent years to request the student's grade level for the year for which they are applying for the Hope Scholarship.

In evaluating the application data, Hope Scholarship staff believe that there likely was some potential confusion about what to report for students entering Kindergarten during the 2022-2023 school year. Staff believe many applicants marked “Kindergarten” as their child’s grade level (thinking they should mark the grade the child would be going into when they received the funds) instead of “Pre-K” to reflect the child’s current status. This would likely explain the large number of Kindergarten students relative to the other grades listed above.

The following data is based on the educational pathway indicated on student’s Notice of Intent (NOI) to withdraw from public school that was submitted to county boards of education as required by statute.





- Native Hawaiian/Other Pacific Islander ■ White





Location of Nonpublic School Payments

The Hope Scholarship Act does not require schools or education service providers to be located in West Virginia. This allows students, especially those in border counties, to seek educational opportunities in surrounding areas that might not be available locally. Additionally, virtual schools or online service providers might be based out-of-state and register to provide services to West Virginia students.


HOPE SCHOLARSHIP

Location of Education Service Provider Payments

An “Education Service Provider” is a person or organization, not including a public or nonpublic school, that is authorized by the Board to receive payments from Hope Scholarship accounts to provide educational goods and services to Hope Scholarship students. Education Service Providers are required to sign up for participation in the Hope Scholarship Program through the online platform. Microschools are also included as Education Service Providers and are required to register through the online platform as well.

The Hope Scholarship Act does not require schools or education service providers to be located in West Virginia. This allows students, especially those in border counties, to seek educational opportunities in surrounding areas that might not be available locally. Additionally, virtual school or online service providers might be based out-of-state and register to provide services to West Virginia students.
